  4. CONMO meeting in October was attended by me and covered the following: [National Strategy](#); [Nurse Practitioner 10 year Plan](#); Reproductive Health Care for Women – nurses and midwives promoting reproductive health as part of the [National Women's Health Strategy 2020-2030](#) ; Federal Government invested \$25.2 million to establish and run the [National Nurse and Midwife Health Service](#) to provide peer-to-peer support and referrals with a focus on nurse/midwife burnout; Pathways of collaboration for nurses and midwives; Strengthening Higher Education with students directed to nursing, teaching and engineering; Fair Work

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Commission – Aged Care workforce increase in wages; Health Workforce Review being championed by Minister Kearney; APHRA report; ANMF – workforce, safe workplace, aiming for gender equity, flexibility of work, balance of power (workers and employers), wages and parental leave and supporting VOICE to Parliament; and a presentation from Megan Jayne-Johnstone on ‘Lessons from a global pandemic’.

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### Vale Joyce Edwards

Joyce Edwards who was an early member of ANTS and a past president passed away recently. Life member in recognition of her contribution.

Joyce commenced her nursing education in the city of her birth, Wollongong, NSW. Following this she completed midwifery training at the Royal Hospital for Women, Paddington and went on to work at the private maternity Hospital run by her mother in Windsor. However, New York City beckoned where she undertook a qualification in Surgical and Operating Theatre at St. Luke's Hospital. More experiences occurred in Canada where she went on to work at Alert Bay on Cormorant Island, a small island lying off the northeast corner of Vancouver Island, which has a small predominantly First Nations population. This was followed by a stint working in Ontario followed by two years in London, U.K. nursing people with burns and plastic surgery. During her time in the USA and the UK, Joyce and friends also found time to explore those countries and Europe.

Joyce had experience in the education of nurses within the hospital and tertiary sector. These included at Royal South Sydney

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Hospital ICU and after receiving a Diploma in Nursing Education from the NSW College of Nursing as a Nurse Educator at the Prince of Wales Hospital Nurse Education Centre. During this time Joyce completed a Bachelor of Arts at the University of New South Wales, followed by a Diploma of Educational Administration at the then Ku-ring-gai College. Joyce was one of 37 nurses awarded a WK Kellogg Fellowship that enabled her to study a Master of Science in Education and Administration at the University of California (San Francisco). The aim of the scholarship was to enable participants to return and contribute to the changes that were occurring at that time in pre-registration nursing education in Australia, and Joyce was appointed as a Principal Lecturer at Sydney College of Advanced Education and later in the Faculty of Nursing at the University of Sydney where she became an Associate Professor. Later she took a role as the Nurse Educator at an Aged Care establishment in Ashfield.

During her time in nursing education Joyce engaged in the Australian Nurse Teacher's Society from the early days of its foundation, including time as President and being made a Life Member. Indeed, it was Joyce who introduced me to the Society once I had located myself to Sydney and I remember the work that Joyce and other members of that time put into steering ANTS forward to become what it is today.

In retirement, Joyce continued to be continually active in her community, being involved in many organisations including President of the Hospital Auxiliary with this culminating with her being awarded Crookwell Citizen of the Year on Australia Day in 2016. Joyce also had a passion for the history of nurses who experienced World War II and was invited as a local speaker on this subject, including on Anzac Day.

## Council of Deans of Nursing and Midwifery issue National Apology

On behalf of the Council of Deans of Nursing and Midwifery (CDNM), Chair Professor Karen Strickland, apologised for the **role of nursing and midwifery education and research** in contributing

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to the harm and ongoing suffering of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives.

*'I recognise that this apology will not erase the pain of the past, nor the intergenerational trauma that has occurred. But it's a vital first step in our future, a vital first step towards healing, and a vital first step towards walking together, building on our shared history, learning from the mistakes of the past and it's my hope that this apology opens a way forward to build a better future for nursing and midwifery in partnership with CATSINaM.'*

Dr Lynore Geia, Bwngcolman woman, nurse, and midwife, responded to the CDN M Apology on behalf of CATSINaM

*'Purposeful action includes working together in real partnership for reform, recognising the unique knowledge and skills that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives bring to the professions in developing reforms for better education, research and clinical practice outcomes. An apology means we commit to each other to repair the professional breach and to also maintain a formal process of accountability to each other for the work we need to do and will do.'*

### CATSINaM celebrates 25th anniversary and its powerful history of collective and individual activism



For 25 years, the Congress of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Nurses and Midwives (CATSINaM) has acted as the national peak professional organisation representing the collective voices of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives in Australia.


With a vision to improve the health and wellbeing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples through increasing the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives CATSINaM looks to lead Australia's nursing and midwifery professions through collaborative processes to improve education, health, and employment outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and particularly the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nursing and midwifery workforce.



In late August, at its National Conference and Gala Dinner, CATSINaM celebrated 25 years since its inception. The three-day event returned to its point of origin on Gadigal Country where it showcased the stories of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives, launched the highly anticipated GENKE II report, and celebrated 25 years of collective and individual acts of activism.

### 'Gettin em n keepin em n growin em'

The conference focussed on the launch of **'gettin em n keepin em n growin em': Strategies for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nursing and midwifery education reform (GENKE II)**. The report



honours previous work completed by the organisation in 2002 titled 'getting em n keepin em': Report of the Indigenous Nursing and Education Working Group (GENKE I) that aimed to address the detrimentally low numbers of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives in the workforce.

The GENKE II report recommendations highlight strategic areas for action to promote Cultural Safety in nursing and midwifery education and practice and to support the growth the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander workforce.

The report recognises that the cultural knowledges and skills of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander nurses and midwives are intrinsically linked to challenging racism in Australian health care systems and to improving health outcomes for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

The NMBA supports the recommendations in the report and will work with CATSINaM to carry out its recommendations.



### Recent Release - Queensland Health Palliative Care Workforce Plan – Palliative and End-of-Life Care Strategy

The Queensland Health (QH) Palliative Care Workforce Plan was published on the 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2022. Key priority areas include:

- Improving equity for rural and remote Queenslanders



- Achieving equity for First Nations peoples
- Delivering unique care for children and youth
- Providing bereavement support
- Supporting spiritual needs.

Significant funding has been allocated to increase the specialist palliative care nursing and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health workforces by over the period 2021 to 2026.

The plan also includes funding for a range of workforce capability development strategies that were proposed / supported by QH Office of the Chief Nursing & Midwifery Officer (OCNMO) including:

- Review of existing Transition to Practice programmes to build on palliative care knowledge and practice to ensure foundation capability within the QH nursing workforce.
- Establishment of an additional 2.0 FTE educator positions in each of the four specialist palliative care hubs to deliver education, training and supervision support for Nursing, Allied Health and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health workforces.
- Creation of additional opportunities for immersive experience in specialist palliative care through the development of a multidisciplinary immersion program, and funding access to PEPA and IPEPA.
- Incentives to support the completion of post graduate qualifications relevant to specialist palliative care (including graduate certificate in Palliative Care and Nurse Practitioner Masters programme).
- Funding for short term leadership mentoring for Nursing and Allied Health practitioners moving into leadership roles.

Of particular interest for members, QH has identified a need to invest in and grow a First Nations specialist palliative care workforce to ensure culturally safe care is provided to First Nations peoples. In addition, general workforce capability can also be improved through:

- Boosting access to quality clinical placements and supervision
- Increasing the number of training positions and clinical exposure to the field of specialist palliative care
- Ongoing education and professional development opportunities, and
- Articulating career pathways.

It is believed that these initiatives will contribute to strong attraction and retention strategies and the reform agenda. The **educational / workforce components have been summarized in the Strategies and Actions section** (page 17):

#### STRENGTHENING the workforce

- Strengthen workforce capacity and capability to deliver quality care through education, training, and development.

- Develop initiatives to support attraction and retention particularly in regional, rural, and remote Queensland.

- 3.1 Increase the number of funded training positions for advanced trainees in palliative medicine.
- 3.2 Promote the inclusion of palliative care in pre-entry and entry level health education programs.
- 3.3 Optimise access to student clinical placements across professions and disciplines.
- 3.4 Implement local approaches to grow staff into desired positions through upskilling and 'Grow-Your-Own' career pathways.
- 3.5 Support access to incentivised immersive experiences in specialist palliative care for new and emerging workforces.
- 3.6 Incentivise post graduate qualifications for specialist palliative care workforces.
- 3.7 Enhance access to programs for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health workforce to build palliative care skills and capability.
- 3.8 Develop succession plans with particular focus on 'critical roles' to support service continuity.
- 3.9 Provide mentoring opportunities for emerging and future specialist palliative care leaders.
- 3.10 Establish and connect educator roles in hub locations Specialist Palliative Rural Telehealth Service (SPaRTa) and Children's Hospital Queensland (CHQ) to support education, training and development for specialist palliative care workforces in regional, rural, remote services.

#### Nursing and Midwifery Workforce Pressures. How can we release the valve?

ANTS was invited to a breakfast and networking event held on 18th November in Sydney by the New South Wales Nurses Association (NSWNA). I was able to represent ANTS at this event. It was a round table event with speakers and some time for table

discussion. Dr Norman Swan was Master of Ceremonies and facilitator for the event.

The speakers were:

- Professor Patricia Davidson, Vice Chancellor - University of Wollongong (who is a well-respected Nurse Researcher and Educator)
- Professor Jim Buchan, Senior Fellow Health Foundation and Adjunct Professor at the University of Technology Sydney (UTS)
- Professor Joanne Gray, President of the Australian College of Midwives, and DVC Education & Students at UTS
- Greg Sharplin, Research and Strategy Manager, Rosemary Bryant Research Centre, University of South Australia
- Professor Marion Eckert, Inaugural Director of the Rosemary Bryant Research Centre (who was on the panel, but did not present)

The event's aim was to bring together professionals from a variety of fields and organisations, including politics, to discuss what we considered important aspects to relieve the pressures on nurses and midwives in the short term, with consideration of future long-term goals. Some main points from the event are described below.

Information was presented that gave Australia's place globally regarding the nursing workforce and the COVID-19 pandemic. In Australia a large survey showed that almost have had their workload significantly increased during the pandemic, and many had signs of burnout and post-traumatic stress disorder. Other interesting data included that we lead the OECD countries in the number of nursing graduates we produce. We are the third highest in the OECD list that had Registered Nurses (RNs) who were trained overseas (18%).

One important piece of data presented was that nurses tend to leave the profession in the first 5 years and those who stay longer than 5 years usually stay for their working life, so it is essential to support RNs in their early career. It was found that early career RNs were being asked to do more double-shifts and overtime than other RNs. Strategies suggested by the group to support early career nurses included not expecting them to take on a full workload, providing more time and valuing professional development and training for all staff, and having mentoring in place. I raised the point of devaluing of education in the clinical area and the need to support staff.

Other aspects of support that could be implemented in the short term by an injection of funding included increased pay, incentives, and childcare. Career support to encourage retention included a new graduate to nurse practitioner/advanced practice nurse/midwife pathway, such as has been developed in Ireland. Professor Davidson reiterated a point that RNs were still core to the workforce and need to be supported.

Scope of practice was identified by many groups as being important to relieve the pressure of nurses and midwives. Stressors for staff can arise

through not being allowed their full scope of practice – giving the care they believe they should deliver, or that staff expertise is not utilised effectively. Skill mix came into the discussion and thinking around ways to do things differently, both in clinical practice, such as models of care, management and nursing and midwifery education.

The discussion points will be collated. I will keep members informed of any further developments. What is important that actions arise from events such as these. We have had a lot of talk in the past so it will be interesting to see how this initiative progresses.

## Review of the Australian Nurse Teacher Professional Competency Standards (EVOLUTIONS)

Dear members,

It has been over 10 years since our Australian Nurse Teacher Professional Standards (the 'Standards') have been reviewed. Given the changing nature of nursing education Dr Christine Taylor (ANTS National Treasurer) is leading a team to review the current Standards (available on the ANTS website at



<https://www.ants.org.au/ants/>). The team consists of Dr Julie Shaw (President), Dr Creina Mitchell (Vice-President), Belinda Foley (National Committee), and Hellen Kaneko (National Committee).

We currently plan a two-phase project. The first phase will be a scoping review and the protocol has been submitted to Open Science Framework (<https://osf.io>). The review aims to find commonalities and gaps in Australian and international competency standards. A Delphi survey is planned for phase two with experts in the field as well as focus groups with nursing educators, including ANTS members. Ethics approval will be sought at Western Sydney University for phase two. The team has also had a research scholarship approved by the ANTS Executive members not involved in the project, which is primarily for the employment of a Research Assistant.

We will keep you updated with our progress, and you can expect open invitations to focus groups next year and also to conference delegates at the 2023 NNEC.

**Do you teach undergraduate wound care or work with clinicians undertaking wound care? – U. K. Recent Release - Explained: Leg washing and periwound care**

Summary of clinical guidance documentation released by Wounds UK on 3rd November 2022

Effective cleansing of the leg and periwound area can have a huge impact on patients' wellbeing and wound healing. Washing a patient's leg is a therapeutic, non-invasive, holistic intervention designed to promote healing and improve patient quality of life (Cooper et al, 2016).

The effective skin care regimen for patients with leg ulcers includes washing (Lindsay, 2007; Lindsay and Stephens, 2008). This has traditionally been done through bucket washing, which involves:

- ☞ Soaking the leg in a clean bucket of warm water
- ☞ Removing dry scales and wound edge encrustations
- ☞ Gently cleansing the leg using soap substitutes
- ☞ Thoroughly drying the limb, particularly between the toes (Cooper et al, 2016).

Not all patients are able to wash their own legs and the periwound area, so the simple act of washing, regardless of the setting, should be considered a reasonable component in improving patient quality of life and wellbeing. Leg washing also affords the clinician time to observe the whole limb in detail, and to soften dry and scaly skin to optimise healing (Cooper et al, 2016).

Special attention should be given to periwound management, which may be achieved through effective and gentle cleansing, as promoting periwound health can lead to:

- ☞ Improved healing
- ☞ Decreased infection risk
- ☞ Reduced dressing frequency and associated cost
- ☞ Reduced pain and discomfort
- ☞ Improved quality of life (Woo et al, 2017).

Patients generally value the washing process, as it may be the only time, they get their leg washed, particularly if they have been in compression and might be aware of odour (Cooper et al, 2016). However, leg washing is often not carried out, because there are logistical barriers, the clinician does not have time, or may not be confident with this aspect of care (Lindsay, 2007; Cooper et al, 2016).

**The limitations of bucket washing**

Leg washing depends on the care environment and it is much easier in some settings than others. With bucket washing, legs are washed in a bucket or bowl and a jug may be used to pour water over the leg. However, these are not always available, or there may not be suitable space to do this safely; plus, filling and carrying heavy buckets of water may be difficult for some clinicians or put them at risk of injury (Cooper et al, 2016). There have been frequent cases of community health staff not being allowed to use a patient's kitchen or being able to access hot water to carry out leg washing (Dhoonmoon and Dyer, 2020).

Depending on the suitability of the environment, there may be increased infection risk due to water quality or potentially contaminated equipment such as bowls or towels. Time constraints can also limit the ability to offer this service on every care visit. Washing the legs of patients can be time-consuming



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and challenging for district nurses, despite care plans stating that legs should be washed at least once a week (Cooper et al, 2016).
