### CoNNMO

CoNNMO is unique in its reach & extensive magnitude if numbers of the combined organisational memberships. It advocates for the health & wellbeing of the Australian population, through empowered, focused & skilled nursing & midwifery workforces. The coalition supports & enhances the leadership, capacity & impact of the goals of member bodies.



The following CoNNMO national priorities were established

through a rigorous process of collaboration & consultation with their member organisations. They guide cotemporary practice & education for our professions.

1. All consumers of healthcare have the right to accessible, safe, high quality care provided by competent, well-educated nurses & midwives.
2. Nurses & midwives lead their professions to improve public awareness of their essential role in the health care system & drive collaborative improvements with other health professionals.
3. Caring, compassion & empathy delivered within a regulated professional framework is an essential element of all aspects of nursing & midwifery practice,.
4. Nurses & midwives are integral to a sustainable, affordable & accessible Australian healthcare system & are essential voices to be included in local, State, Territory & Federal health policy discussions & decision making.

5. Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander health, history, culture & cultural safety are core elements of nursing & midwifery education & practice. A National Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Nursing & Midwifery Strategy is urgently required.
6. Nurses & midwives must adopt a zero-tolerance approach to bullying, racism, harassment, sexism & all other forms of discrimination that have no place in nursing & midwifery practice.
7. Embedding mentoring & reflective practice into the growth & development of all nurses & midwives is essential.
8. Work must be undertaken to remove legislative, regulatory & administrative barriers that prevent nurses & midwives from practicing to their full scope of practice.
9. Collaborating & working in partnership with nursing & midwifery professional organizations is essential to progressing evidence informed practice.
10. Nurses & midwives need to be literate in digital health, to communicate, collaborate & provide optimal healthcare.
11. Nurses & midwives must be supported & resources to lead research & innovation
12. Nurses & midwives must use their considerable, informed & united voices to advocate for improvements in health & wellbeing for all.

Temporary short-term service enhancements as part of a suite of pandemic responses (remaining until the 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022) include:

- ☞ The option of a one-off 50-minute session with experienced counsellors and
- ☞ The option to link out to other available support services

## Contributed Articles

### Clinical Coaching & Practice Development

Over a decade ago our service transitioned from the traditional nurse educator role supporting clinical education in the

classroom across the breadth of the service. Our existing service model was no longer able to sustain the rapidly expanding, acutely busy and highly technical health service we were becoming. The implementation of the Clinical Coach role evolved from a need to do this differently. For example: clinicians seeking more clinical education at the bedside, nurse educators working independently in Clinical Service Line silos, resulting in multiple education reporting lines and poorly documented educational outcomes and a lack of coordination / inefficiencies in the education service. Additionally, there was an inequitable distribution across the service which included a large regional hospital with several rural hospitals. There was a distinct focus on mandatory, corporate, and organisational programmes rather than clinical ones, and the nurse educator role was perceived as less than valuable in some areas. In some instances, this resulted in an increasing clinical disconnect between clinical areas and the educator role. Significantly the ratio of educators to clinical nursing staff was inadequate resulting in a lack of visibility of educators. It was determined that existing facilitator models lacked the structure and outcomes we wanted to achieve across our health service. These challenges were reflected in the literature and confirmed by numerous taskforces, reviews, and investigations into the state of Nursing Educator across Australia.

There are common complaints across our nation as health services expanded without parallel investment in education infrastructure. This was occurring in our own health service, so we set out to identify our issues and challenges in order to provide guidance on where improvements could be made to our service model. Practice Development and transformational leadership we believed would allow us to achieve organisational change via a whole of service educational framework with Unit-based coaching at its heart. We hoped that practice development would allow us to move from a commanding, authoritative, structured, and hierarchical standpoint towards a place of being more consensual, participative – collaborative, flexible and more organic, i.e., in touch with our roots. The introduction of Clinical Coaches at the bedside, embedded in clinical units allowed us to achieve our goal with no increase in Nurse Educator hours despite the introduction of a large tertiary hospital into the mix. Clinical Coaches are guided by the “Clinical Coach Framework” this consists of five (5) pillars:

1. Clinical Induction – orientation to the unit or to a new role within the unit
2. Preceptor support – helping the existing staff to help newer staff

3. Clinical development – skills training and the development of a learning culture at the grass roots
4. Mandatory & Requisite training – knowing the organisational rules of the game as well as the clinical ones needed to function as an effective clinician in a specific clinical area
5. Safe practice – team protection, risk management and driving quality improvement from the ground up.

Providing clinical education at the point of care meant that we could support clinicians while they were DOING Nursing & Midwifery practice – this allowed us to re-engage education with clinical practice. “Before we can manage and lead we must be able to understand and connect” (McCordle, 2006; Fell, 2022).

Our Clinical Coach Framework is built on adult leaning principles and the lessons learnt from our historical models of preceptorship, facilitation, and buddying. However, it moves beyond this to a more diverse approach based on a range of teachings, such as: practice development philosophy, life coaching, health coaching and even spiritual development (Liney, 2006; McCormack et al, 1999; McCormack et al, 2011; Unsworth, 2008). However, the main influence came from sports coaching (Lyle, 2002; Jones et al, 2004, 2009). Sports’ coaching doesn’t come from a complicated pedagogy – it simply aims to find a way to bring out the best in every player and to make sure team culture is positive in order to achieve a common goal. This married with practice development which is also dependent on creating a positive culture. We felt that coaches would be at the core of driving cultural change. They have and in a collaborative research project with the University of the Sunshine Coast and La Trobe University, The Sunshine Coast Hospital & Health Service Practice Development Team have established they have a significant role to play in safe practice (Thompson, Lin, Faithfull-Byrne et al, 2021).

To measure the ongoing impact of this role the Clinical Coach team report on a number of measurable outcomes which are linked to the Clinical Coach Framework. These are:

- Clinical induction
- Performance review completion rates
- Percentage (%) of staff trained in preceptorship (or ‘Coaching in Practice’)
- Staff satisfaction with the coach role
- Current unit based clinical education plan
- Core clinical competencies identified (a.k.a. requisite education)

- % of staff completing mandatory training
- identification and support for portfolio holders (as identified in the organisations portfolio framework)
- Audit results / action plans included in individual unit Inservice programmes and clinical coach approved versus actual FTE.

These measurable allow reflection in investment achievement of educational outcomes at a unit / department level. For instance, team culture -investment in personal development, and the development of others. Individual units identify cores requirements pertaining to the education and assessment of team members and their ability to function as an effective member of the team to achieve clinical outcomes for their patients; this is supported by Requisite Education Frameworks (REFs) in participating clinical areas. These are managed at a Unit / Department and sometimes Service level with input from Nurse Unit Managers, Clinical Nurse Consultants, Associate Clinical Nurse Consultants, Nursing Directors and the Practice Development Nursing & or Midwifery Educators. In addition, clinicians are supported by a number of Clinical Assessment Tools (CATs), Clinical Tools (TOOLS and TIPs) and in some instances Tutorials (TUTES). These can be used formally to access achievement against the standard or as an at the point of care support document to guide clinical practice or clinical education.

Our clinical coaches as the clinical experts or teachers in the clinical setting work to embed clinical education support at point of care via our team mantras – “Do with not for” (Rodriguez-Gil, 2011) and “Be the guide on the side not the sage on the stage” (King, 1993). The power of these mantras allows us to empower the learned within every clinician and to build confidence and competence with the clinical knowledge and expertise of their unit-based coach. This leads to our final mantra – “Give a man a fish and he eats for a day. Teach him to fish and he can feed his village for life” (Adaptation – debated authorship - ?Lao Tzu, 4<sup>th</sup> Century).

The Clinical Coach Framework directly impacts on the practice standards of nursing & midwifery clinicians across our service by utilising both practice development & educational methodologies as a vehicle to improve the culture of learning. Our team has identified seven (7) critical success factors as enabling the application of the practice development model to the business of service delivery in clinical education across our service.

### SCHHS Practice Development Service Model

- Lead** and manage clinical education
- Align** educational outcomes to service plans & budget
- Develop** systems to support education
- Create** a strong learning culture & team unity
- Embed** education into practice
- Support** individual development plans
- Evaluate**, measure and report education
