### Wellbeing for Nurses & Midwives

*The pandemic has placed nurses and midwives under an unprecedented level of additional stress, in a context where healthcare workers were already struggling with major work-related challenges including anxiety, depression, compassion fatigue and burnout. However, despite the huge pressure we have seen during the pandemic, and the wide range of support services directly available to health professionals, I am still hearing reports of low uptake of these services.*

*There are a number of resources available to support the mental health of the health workforce when they feel they need it. For example, the Black Dog Institute's **The Essential Network (TEN)** provides a blended care mental health support service for healthcare workers that offers specialist, individualised mental health advice. You can find out more about this service by visiting the Black Dog Institute's [website](#).*

*The Department of Health has also funded initiatives to embed mental health skills in the broader health workforce. Resources such as the **Mental Health Professional's Network (MHPN)** supports the health workforce through delivery of professional multidisciplinary and intraprofessional networks and online development programs and webinars for health and mental health practitioners – such as mental health nurses and special interest groups – who support people with or at risk of mental illness. This includes a number of webinars focussing on maintaining and caring for your mental health and wellbeing while working in healthcare setting. Visit the MHPN [website](#) for more information and easy to navigate links to podcasts, online forums and a range of other useful resources.*

*Nurses and midwives can also access digital mental health services available to the broader community by visiting [headtohealth.gov.au](#). These services are free or low cost, and cover a range of counselling, treatment and crisis support services. There is no shame in reaching out for help. It is a strength, and I myself have used these services on a regular basis. I can reassure you they are confidential and can help in many ways. If you or anyone you know is struggling, do reach out to the support there especially for you.*

## Expansion of the Aged Care Transition to Practice Program

The Aged Care Transition to Practice (ACTTP) Program has expanded. It now offers streams for newly graduated enrolled nurses, and experienced registered nurses who are new to the aged care sector.

Newly graduated registered nurses continue to be eligible for the program. The ACTTP Program supports new aged care nurses with mentorship and training. To date over 400 nurses have commenced the program. Read more information, including how to participate in the ACTTP Program, on the department's [website](#).

## Collaborative Arrangements Review / Legislation

The department has commissioned an independent review of collaborative arrangements for participating midwives and nurse practitioners. The review will provide greater clarity on the efficacy of collaborative arrangements and highlight any unintended barriers. The review will be conducted through stakeholder consultation and a comprehensive review of Australian and international research literature.

Consultation has commenced, comprising invitations to representative organisations to participate in interviews, focus groups, and to disseminate an online survey to members. The findings of the review will inform future policy settings on collaborative arrangements.

The National Health (Collaborative arrangements for midwives) Determination 2010, National Health (Collaborative arrangements for nurse practitioners) Determination 2010 and National Health (Eligible midwives) Determination 2010 will sunset on 30 September 2022. These determinations provide the legislative basis for Nurse Practitioners and Participating Midwives to claim for relevant Medicare Benefits Schedule (MBS) items and grants them authority to write prescriptions working within a collaborative arrangement. **To ensure that Nurse Practitioners and Participating Midwives can continue the important work that they do, the Department will renew the three determinations as an interim measure.** This will allow the independent review of collaborative arrangements to be completed so that a considered policy decision can be made on the future of collaborative arrangements.

## The Nursing in Primary Health Care Program

The Government extended the **Australian Primary Health Care Nursing Association's (APNA) funding for an addition 12 months to deliver the Nursing in Primary Health Care (NiPHC) Program.** The \$10 million funded NiPHC program that supports reform and innovation initiatives in the primary health care nursing workforce, provides a **Transition to Practice Program** for new graduates and experienced nurses to transition to primary health care settings; building nurse capacity clinics; and chronic disease management and health ageing program that includes access to training modules and support. ## Nursing Postgraduate Scholarship

The Nursing Postgraduate Scholarship under the **Mental Health Nursing, Allied Health and Psychology Scholarships Program** provides

up to \$30,000 for nurses working in or intending to work in the mental health sector to undertake postgraduate study. Applications for studies commencing or continuing in 2023 will open on Monday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2022 and close on Monday 10 October 2022. - Responding to at-risk groups

Each six-week Unit includes two one-hour Zoom workshops and four hours of online interactive learning which equates to six professional development hours. ## Updates position statement on Cosmetic Surgery

The NMBA has recently made amendments to the Position Statement: Nurses and cosmetic medical procedures. The position statement gives guidance for:

- All nurses working in the area of cosmetic medical procedures, including specific advice for enrolled nurses, registered nurses and nurse practitioners
- Cosmetic injections – detailed expectations of prescribers and the role of the registered nurse and enrolled nurse
- Supervision requirements for enrolled nurses, and
- Registered nurses with sole qualification in mental health nursing, paediatric nursing or disability nursing seeking to practice in the area of cosmetic medical procedures

Ahpra and the Medical Board of Australia are conducting a separate review into cosmetic surgery. The NMBA may amend the Position Statement: Nurses and cosmetic medical procedures again in the future, based on the recommendations of this review. ## Have your say on the English language skills registration standards – public consultation (closes 7<sup>th</sup> September)

Public consultation on the English language skills registration standards opens today. National Boards are inviting practitioners, community members, employers, education providers and other stakeholders to have their say.

### What are the English language skills registration standards?

Each of the 15 National Boards set requirements for English language skills to make sure all registered health practitioners can communicate effectively in English to provide safe care. These requirements are outlined in the English Language Skills Registration Standards (the ELS standards). The ELS standards are one of five core registration standards required by all National Boards and applies to all applicants at initial registration, whether they qualified in Australia or overseas.

### Why have the English language skills registration standards been reviewed?

The ELS standards have been reviewed by their respective National Boards<sup>1</sup> (except the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health Practice Board of Australia) to make sure they are current and keep pace with our changing and dynamic environment.

National Boards have only proposed changes where clear improvements have been identified, such as providing more clarity, addressing gaps in information and aligning the standards with available evidence for best practice. You can read about the changes in the consultation paper.

### How can you have your say?

Public consultation opens today and will be open for eight weeks until 7<sup>th</sup> September 2022. We've published a consultation paper on our consultations webpage which we encourage you to read.



We've also published Frequently asked questions (FAQs) about our approach to the review and information about the literature review we carried out.

Martin Fletcher, Ahpra CEO, is encouraging people to have their say on this important registration standard.

'An ELS standard applies to every registered health practitioner in Australia, and this plays a crucial role in ensuring safe care for, and protection of, the public. We appreciate the early feedback we've received which has helped refine the proposals for public consultation. Now we look to you for your feedback on this important work and I strongly encourage you to have your say', Mr Fletcher said.

### Supervised Practice

National Boards and Ahpra have developed the *Supervised practice framework* (the framework) to create a responsive and risk-based approach to supervised practice across the National Scheme.

Supervised practice reassures the community, National Boards and Ahpra that a registered health practitioner whose practice is being supervised (the supervisee) is safe and competent to practise and is not putting the public at risk.

The framework has been developed to:

- give guidance when supervised practice is required to meet registration requirements, conditions or undertakings
- set out core components that support high-quality, safe and effective supervised practice
- support consistent processes and decision making within Ahpra

- help supervisees and supervisors better understand what is expected of them
- be clearer, relevant and user-friendly.

The framework outlines the principles which underpin supervised practice, the levels of supervised practice and the National Boards' expectations of supervisees, supervisors and employers. It also explains Ahpra and the Boards' compliance processes and gives guidance on how to effectively comply with supervised practice requirements. [Read the framework.](#)

### Supervision guidelines

Some registration standards used by National Boards refer to supervision guidelines. New *Supervision guidelines* (the guidelines) have been developed to:

- replace any previously approved supervision guidelines or framework from National Boards, and
- adopt the framework.

Changes to relevant registration standards to explicitly refer to the framework rather than supervision guidelines will be made at a later date. [Read the guidelines.](#)

## ACN Media Release – Brisbane Nurse wins 2022 Health Minister's Award for Nursing Trailblazers

(18<sup>th</sup> August 2022)



A nurse who started a charity from a granny flat in her parent's backyard to reduce hospital waste has taken out one of the Australian nursing profession's most prestigious honours.

Brisbane's Claire Lane MACN was today named the 2022 winner of the Health Minister's Award for Nursing Trailblazers, a national award recognising nurses whose leadership has led to innovative solutions addressing key challenges facing our health and aged care systems.

Claire received the award for her work with Save our Supplies, a for-purpose organisation that collects excess clean usable medical supplies from hospitals. Working with Rotary, they redirect the supplies to areas of need, including developing nations, war-torn areas like Ukraine and Flood impact regions of Australia.

The announcement was made at the Australian College of Nursing (ACN) National Nursing Forum in Darwin by Assistant Minister for Health and Aged Care Ged Kearney. ACN CEO Adjunct Professor Kylie Ward FACN congratulated Claire on becoming the fourth nurse – and third successive from Queensland – to win the Health Minister's Award for Nursing Trailblazers.



"Claire is an exceptional woman and nurse who has used her leadership, expertise and passion for social impact – characteristics our profession prides itself on – to make the world and future a better place," Adjunct Professor Ward said.

"She not only created an innovative solution to address one of the biggest challenges facing our healthcare systems but has gone above and beyond to use it to improve the health of people across the world.

"She exemplifies the mission of the Health Minister's Award for Nursing Trailblazers, showcasing to Australians the leading role nurses' skills and expertise play in shaping the lives of those we care for.

Assistant Minister Ged Kearney noted the honour she felt as a nurse to announce the recipient of the Health Minister's Award for Nursing Trailblazers. She also reflected on "how proud she was to have been a nurse" and that she wanted "every single nurse to be proud of what you do every day for all Australians".

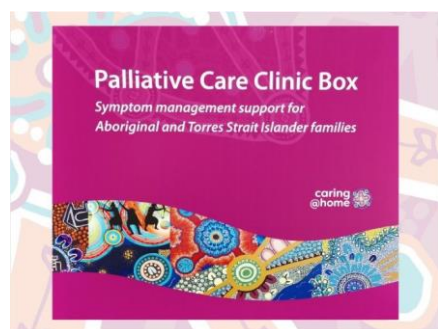
