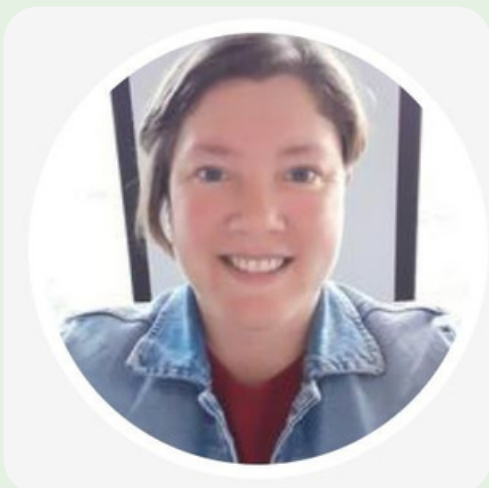

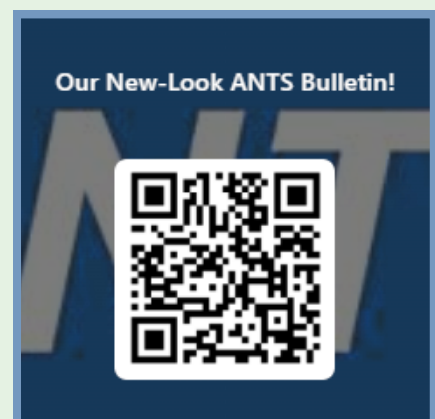

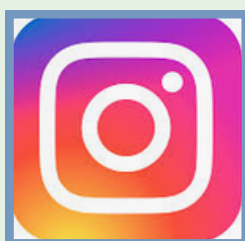

Eligibility for membership: ANTS comprises of Ordinary, Honorary, and Life Members.

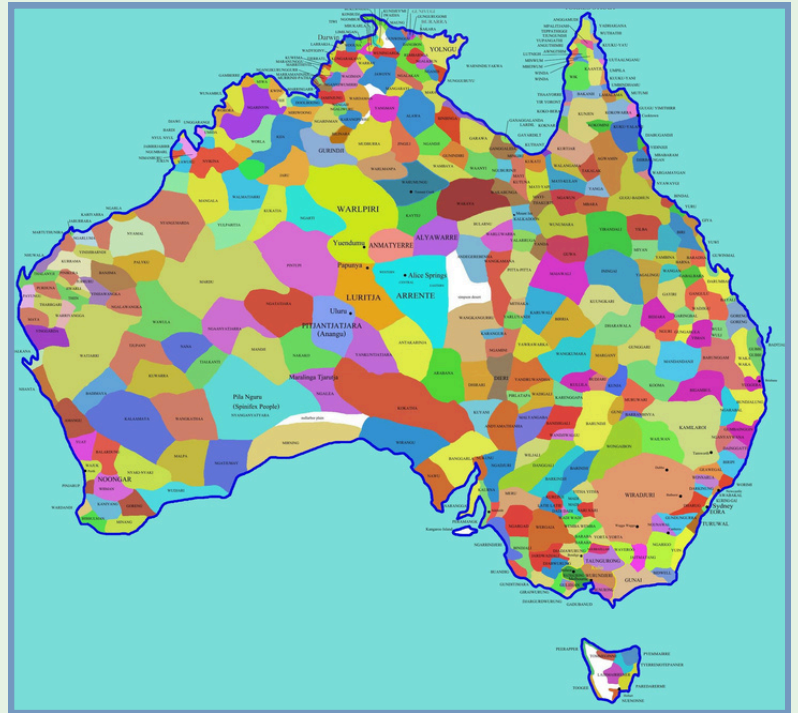
Ordinary Membership categories are:

Welcome to this bulletin's digital segment. We are diving into one of the most transformative innovations in healthcare today: Artificial Intelligence - AI-powered medical scribes. These intelligent tools are reshaping clinical workflows by reducing documentation burdens, improving accuracy, and giving clinicians more time to focus on patient care. These AI powered scribes are developed with a target audience - medical officers, with applied adaptations now as many allied health and nursing colleagues are also using these programs. So how do health services ensure that the most suitable program is implemented and what are the clinician's professional responsibilities and obligations? In addition, how do we achieve AI literacy in clinical and tertiary education programs?

The Australasian Institute of Digital Health (AIDH) have published an information sheet on the 'Implementation of AI scribes in healthcare workflows.' This information sheet provides an introduction on how to select and evaluate an AI solution. AHPRA have also developed a resource that provides guidance on 'meeting your professional obligations when using artificial intelligence in healthcare.' Chen and McGregor (2025) explore the practical applications of AI within simulation and propose a model of thinking that provides scholars with structure to conceptualise how they can approach the integration of AI within their simulation programs.
