

99 New procedure-shorter stay.

The new technique of percutaneous laparoscopic cholecystectomy being performed at The Williamstown Hospital in 1990. In this procedure the gallbladder is removed using a laparascope with the surgeon looking at a television monitor. This results in minimal scarring and enables the patient to leave hospital after two days and return to full activities in a week

35 The Female Ward, 1920. The Ward was opened in 1917 with 13 beds. In 1986 it was converted to provide a Short Stay Unit, with a nurses' station and eleven inpatient beds. The Short Stay Unit operates from Monday to Friday, and accommodates adult male and female patients undergoing surgical procedures as day patients or as relatively short stay patients.

- All of the education occurred in the same organisation I was both student and employee.




Nurses role in Health 1900-1970s

A firmly established role differentiation in hospitals, where nurses were poorly educated doctors' handmaidens. Doctors filled the scientific clinical role, and nurses provided the expressive, domestic and hygiene role, and a model for nursing education was firmly established... Sheean 1995

..the present staff establishment of schools of nursing, as stipulated by the Hospitals and Charities commission is hopelessly inadequate and affords no opportunity to encourage and prepare potential nurse educators for any proposed improvement in curriculum.

Nursing was not only transferred to highereducation but also transformed from and advanced education discipline to a university discipline and from diploma status to degree status. In that sense the preparation of RNs was shifted further from its origins in the health sector than some might have expected..... In the Universities nursing can more fully develop a research base, which is crucial to the development of the nursing profession.


